and turned one double play in the game.

The second game was over early, as Council Grove erupted for 11 runs in the first inning en route to a 15-0 win. The inning included RBI singles from Kepley, Buttrey, Doornbos, and Villalobos; a bases-loaded walk from AJ Rocha; another RBI single from Kepley; and a run-scoring groundout from Buttrey.

The Braves added four more in the second, capitalizing on a Wabaunsee error and three bases-loaded walks issued to Rocha, Kepley, and Stewart.

Braun Frye secured the win by pitching two hitless innings with three strikeouts. Beckett Nelson followed with a clean inning of relief, striking out two without allowing a baserunner.

Council Grove collected 11 hits. Kepley led with four RBIs and went 2-for-2. Frye, Kepley, and Villalobos each notched two hits. Rocha and Reid Buttrey drew two walks apiece. The Braves stole seven bases, with Frye and Villalobos swiping multiple bags. Defensively, Council Grove played error-free baseball, and Senne led the team with five fielding chances.

The Braves will host Mission Valley on Thursday.



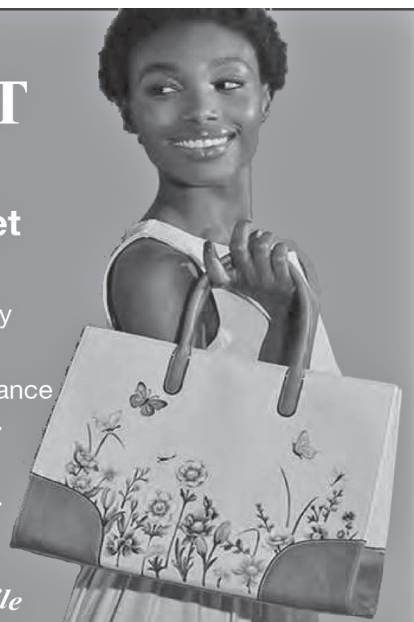
