RESOLUTION 2025-10 CITY OF COTTONWOOD FALLS MAINTAINING THE GRASS FOR LAWNS AND/OR LOTS FOR HABITUAL GRASS

ORDINANCES VIOLATIONS The City of Cottonwood Falls will send out one notification by mail to violation offenders of Ordinance No. 763 -Section 7-301 h. Growth of rank of grass twelves inches in height or length if matted down, noxious weeds, regardless of their height.

The City of Cottonwood Falls will send out one notice informing property owner and/or tenant of the violation pertaining to Ordinance No. 763 - Section7-301h. A response may be mailed, or phone call can be made to the City Office within ten days of the date of the letter. If the lawn and/or lot is not maintained within the ten days of letter, the city on their own discretion will maintain the lawn and the fine will be \$150.00. Each additional violation the fee will be another \$150.00. fI there are obstacles on or in the lawn, grass, weeds or property that may have to be removed there will be additional costs. fI there is damage to the mower or blades due to the obstacles on or in the property it will be billed to the property owner and/or tenant of the property.

In maintaining the lawn and/or lot fi the city sees the need to maintain the lawn and/or lot; before the grass or weeds reach twelves inches due to weather conditions or scheduling conflicts. The city will maintain the property without fur-ther notification of the property owner and/or tenant when maintenance of the lawn and/or lot is required.

Resolution 2025-10 was approved on June 16, 2025.

Falling tree limb injures firefighter, medic and patient during rescue

WICHITA (KAKE) - A firefighter, a medic and a patient were all injured Sunday evening when a large tree branch unexpectedly fell during a rescue operation, according to the Wichita Fire Department.

The fire department says on Sunday evening, Squad 11 responded to the report of a medical in the 1800 block of S. Madison.

The patient had fallen while cutting a tree, the fire department said. "While tending to the patient, part of the tree broke free and dropped into the area where the patient was being assessed," WFD said in a social media post on Monday. "One of our firefighters was able to move a medic student away from the impacted area to safety, as a second firefighter shielded the patient from being struck. It is estimated that the piece of tree that struck our firefighter and one medic weighted approximately 150 pounds and fell approximately 25 feet."

Suspect accused of starting wheat field fires

RILEY COUNTY (JC POST) -Law enforcement are investigating two cases of alleged arson.

Just before 6 p.m. Friday, officers filed a report for arson near the inter-

section of Walsburg Road and Madison Creek Road in Leonardville, according to the Riley County Police Department activity report.
