The United States Constitution was adopted on September 17, 1787, and provided a unique system of government unknown to any nation on earth. The founding of the United States changed the world.

Though these are consequential events in world history, neither has impacted humankind like the incarnation and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. He did not just change the world, He altered history, has caused the rise and fall of nations and effected the eternal existence of billions of souls. The incarnation of Jesus

6 and 4 B.C. According to Webster's dictionary, incarnation is a word that describes "the embodiment of a deity or spirit in some earthy form." In particular, it refers to the birth of Christ, when the Lord God took on human form and became one of us. This is called the Doctrine of the Incarnation. It is said of Jesus "...the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14) The incarnation is the moment in history when the God who made the heavens and the earth, made Himself a simple and normal looking man who came to live among us,

The resurrection of Jesus took place outside of Jerusalem about 33 A.D. Before this miracle, day's earlier Jesus was arrested and tried by authorities on false charges of blasphemy. The high priest demanded of Him saying, "I adjure you by the living God, tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God." (Matthew 26:63) When Jesus told them the truth, they responded with rage, "He has uttered blasphemy. What further witnesses do we need? You have now heard his blasphemy." Purpose

God has a purpose for each of us. Some of us have been called to his Son, Jesus, perhaps much like Judas was called to be a disciple. Remember that Jesus chose Judas and Jesus knew from the beginning what Judas was going to do. There were no surprises here. It had to be that way for the prophecies to be fulfilled. Notice in Matthew 27 that when Judas realized his sin, he was filled with remorse. He confessed his sin! Today, we call that behavior "repentance."

When we come to the point where we see our sins and are filled with remorse we confess that Jesus is Lord and are forgiven. Believe it or not Judas was saved by the shed blood of Jesus Christ. Jesus died on the cross for all mankind. That sacrifice included Judas and every other human being who ever lived or ever will live. Does that mean that Judas went to Heaven when he hung himself? Does his repentance mean that Judas now has eternal life? Well, those are issues that only Jesus is qualified to judge.

It is fascinating to look at the relationship Judas had with the other disciples. Judas really looked good; he was on the ministry team. For well over three years he walked with them, ate with them, fellow shipped with them, heard the same sermons and they never had a clue that he was a thief (John 12:6) or that he was going to betray Jesus. But, then again, I doubt that anyone except Jesus thought Peter would deny his Lord and Savior.

My friend, the point is this: there is no need for you to go out and hang yourself, like Judas did. Repent of you sins, ask for forgiveness, be baptized and receive the Holy Spirit and eternal life. No matter what sins you may have committed, they are forgiven and covered by the shed blood of Jesus Christ when you repent.

The parables of the tares amongst the wheat and the separation of the sheep from the goats which Jesus shared should remind each of us that we are not just here to "look" good. We have been called to Jesus Christ to bear fruit and carry on His life and His work in this world. Yet, I wonder at just how easy it might be to look really good in the eyes of the world and still betray a Savior who loves us and gave his life

Let me leave you with some food for thought from 2 Peter 1:10 (NLT) "So, dear brothers and sisters, work hard to prove that you really are among those God has called and chosen. Do these thing, and you will never fall away." You see, you may be able to fool others and even fool yourself, but God knows your heart and your intent. Still Jesus has a purpose for your life. Will you make the most of it?
