

# Historic Times: The Battle Of Quebec

Those of us who teach history are always looking for “turning points.” Since we are re-creating past events, we know what happened. The trick, however, is to try to determine why it happened the way it did. These occurrences are the turning points.

Athletic contests often have them. One team was winning a football game, for example, until their quarterback got hurt and could no longer play. Thus, they lost the game instead of winning it.

Wars always have turning points. One early war in U.S. history was the French and Indian War of the 1750s and 1760s. It pitted the American colonists and Great

Britain (on one side) against the French and their Native American allies (on the other side).

The French and Indian War was fought because the British wanted the New World lands that the French claimed. The turning point of the war was the Battle of Quebec in 1759.

Quebec is located on the St. Lawrence River. While part of the city is at sea level, part of it is located on a cliff high above the river.

The French controlled the city, and expected the British to attack it. They did not expect the assault to come from the area of the city that was on the cliff. “It is not supposed that the enemies have wings,” the French commander supposedly re-

marked.

But British troops had noticed women walking down the cliff to wash clothes in the river, and ascending the cliff once their chores were done. Close inspection revealed that the women had carved footholds in the cliff to allow them to get to and from the river quickly and easily.

So, just as quickly and easily, the British troops scaled the cliff in the middle of the night and launched a surprise attack on French troops.

As a result, the British won the Battle of Quebec and won the French and Indian War. Consequently, the French lost their New World lands. This is one reason most of us today speak English and not French.
