# Historic Times: The Midnight Ride Of ... Whom?

One of the literary works most of us remember from school is "Paul Revere's Ride," a poem by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. It forever implanted in our minds the vision of Revere riding in 1775 to warn Massachusetts colonists that the British were coming!

For months, British troops in Boston had been dealing with increasingly militant colonists who were, according to rumor, stockpiling guns and ammunition. British officials decided

that they needed to stop this activity before it led to greater problems for them. British soldiers left Boston on the night of April 18, 1775, looking for weapons and hoping to arrest two troublemakers, Samuel Adams and John Hancock.

Revere left Boston shortly after the troops did, to warn the locals that they were in imminent danger. The next day, the colonists stood their ground against the British redcoats at the battles of Lexington and Concord. The Revolutionary War had begun!

But Longfellow played fast and loose with the facts. He used "poetic license" to alter events to meet his literary needs. The result is a great poem—but lousy his-

A second rider, William Dawes, left Boston when Revere did-but took a different route. Both Revere and Dawes arrived at Lexington and issued their warnings. Then, they headed toward Concord.

Before long, they met a young local medical doctor, Samuel Prescott, who

decided to ride with them. The three men were soon waylaid, however, by British troops. In an attempt to avoid capture, they rode off in different directions.

Dawes escaped, but his horse threw him and he ended his night by w alking back to Lexington. Revere was captured and briefly detained by British troops before being released in Lexington. The only one of the three who got to Concord and warned the locals there was Prescott.

But neither Dawes nor Prescott appear in Longfellow's poem. Historians of the American Revolution think that both men were as important—and perhaps more so—than Revere. But it is Revere who became famous—thanks to Longfellow's historically inaccurate

# Tick, Tick, Tick: Warm Weather Creates Opportunity For Blood-Sucking Parasite By Pat Melgares, K-State into pants to limit tick ac-

MANHATTAN, KS – 'Tis the season for warmer temperatures, getting outdoors and playing in green, grassy fields – all fun, but also conditions that favor a bloodsucking parasite that preys on humans, pets and live-Due to the early warming

weather, Kansas State University entomologist Cassandra Olds said ticks have already been found around Manhattan in mid-March. Many tick bites are

harmless, but some ticks can transmit pathogens causing diseases such as Lyme disease and Rocky Mountain spotted fever. Olds said that avoiding tick bites is the first level of defense.

"Be careful when you're outdoors, especially when you're in an area with long grass," she said. "Ticks need to be protected from the elements, so they like to be in the grass and leaf litter, but then they come out looking for a meal."

When in tall grassy areas, Olds suggests tucking pants into socks, and shirts

cess to your skin. You can even duct tape shirt sleeves "You just really want to

limit the entry points where a tick can get in," she said. "Then, once you're back indoors, take off your clothes, put them in the wash and do a full body check." If a tick is found on the

body, and it is not embedded you can pick it off to remove. If it has attached, Olds suggests using the thumb and forefinger to pull it away from the body with steady but firm pressure. Olds said that once a

tick finds a host, it must penetrate the skin, secure its mouth parts and initiate feeding - which takes about 24 to 48 hours. She said that if ticks can be repelled, prevented from attaching or killed during this period, then it reduces the chance that it will have transmitted a pathogen. "I always get people freaked out when I say this, but you should then store that tick in a Ziploc bag in the freezer for two weeks," she said. "If regular application of acariby chance that tick was carrying (a pathogen) and you start getting flu-like symptoms, or feeling sick, you can then take that tick with you to your doctor or send to (K-State's Department of Entomology) for identification. If is also available at local exwe know what tick species it is, it narrows down what you might be infected with, which gives us a head start for treatment."

The tick species that most commonly infest people and domestic animals in Kansas are the American dog tick, lone star tick, winter tick, and the blacklegged tick (or

The American dog tick can also induce tick paralysis, which is caused by components in tick saliva. Tick paralysis occurs more frequently in children and smaller animals and can often be reversed by removing the tick in a timely manner.

The lone star tick is one that people come across more commonly in Kansas. The female tick is brown, with a white spot on it; the male is similar-looking, but without the white spot.

The lone star tick can transmit several pathogens, but is also known to cause the malady known as alphagal syndrome, or an allergy to mammalian food products or items with animal additives, including several medications.

Full descriptions and pictures of ticks common to the Sunflower State are available in a publication from K-State Research and Extension, titled 'Ticks in Kansas,' which can be accessed online. To protect dogs, cats and livestock, Olds said a cides – which are pesticides used to kill ticks and mites – may be necessary. She suggests consulting with a veterinarian for the best recommendation to protect animals. More information tension offices in Kansas.
