April 2 Meeting

Mayor Angie Alexander called the meeting to order at 5:00pm. Council woman Tammy McDaniel was the only councilmember in attendance. Council President Matt Gardner and Councilmembers Taner Hayes, Bucky Smith, and Paul Calvert were unable to attend. City Clerk Lori Ryan, City

Superintendent Jay Spengler, and Chief of Police Chuck Berry were in attendance as well. In order to make a quorum and pay bills, President Gardner had to be called. McDaniel motioned to approve the Consent Agenda with 4/4/25 Payroll Appropriations Ordinance #7368 for \$11,190.63 and Gardner seconded. Expenditure Appropriation Ordinance #7347 in the amount of \$13,578.83 was motioned for approval by McDaniel and seconded by Gardner. Vote passed 3-0 with Mayor having to vote too.

### Pair of Seniors Return to Lead Attica Golf Team

Two seniors return to the Attica golf team this season and two freshmen will join

Seniors Carter Swingle and Mac Harnden are back for the Bulldogs and head coach Craig Winters said their goal is to score low enough to compete at Regionals.

"The seniors are bringing two years of both JV and varsity experience with them this year," Winters said. "They both will be competing in five varsity tournaments, not counting HOPL League and Regionals. They were close to

making our team goal of 95 last year to go to Regionals and are determined to get to the postseason play this year."

Freshmen Jack Alexander and Juaquin Ybarra are new to the team and they will compete in four tournaments this season.

"My goal for them is to get a season's worth of fundamentals and competitive play under their belts," Winters said. "As the season progresses, they might also challenge to compete in some varsity events as well."

The head coach said that the players are "shaking off the rust from the offseason" because it's early in practice but they are making progress.

"Our swings are starting to come back for the experienced golfers and the newcomers are learning fundamentals, rules every day," Winters said. "The team is putting in the work so far and both teams are excited for the season to begin. We have set a team goal of getting better every day."

Along with the expected improvement from the freshmen, Winters said, his expectation for the two seniors is that they continue to improve, compete well in the league tournament and reach the goal of competing in postseason play.

The Bulldogs opened the

season Thursday at the Pratt invitational. Carter Swingle shot 109 and tied for 31st place and Mac Harnden shot 120 and placed 37th. There were 46 golfers who competed, most of them from schools in Classes 3A

Meanwhile, the junior varsity golfers opened at the Chaparral JV tournament April 1. Jack Alexander shot 63 and placed 10th and Juaquin Ybarra shot 77 and placed 22nd. There were 24 golfers who competed.

The Bulldogs were scheduled to compete in the Chaparral varsity tournament Tuesday, then head to the Medicine Lodge JV tournament Thursday.
