Public notice is hereby given that the City Council of the City of Caney, Kansas (the "Issuer"), will conduct a public hearing on May 5, 2025 at 6:30 p.m., or as soon thereafter as may be heard in the City Council Chambers, 100 W. 4th, Caney, KS in regard to the issuance by the Issuer of its Taxable Industrial Revenue Bonds (Spears Manufacturing Project), in a principal amount not to exceed \$13,200,000 (the "Bonds") and in regard to an exemption from ad valorem taxation of property constructed or purchased with the proceeds of such Bonds. The Bonds are proposed to be issued by the Issuer under authority of K.S.A. 121740 et seq., as amended, to pay the costs of the acquisition, construction and equipping of additional facilities adjacent to an existing manufacturing facility located at 1200 South State Street, Caney, Kansas. The Issuer further intends to lease such facility to R.W. Spears, LLC, a Nevada limited liability company, or another legal entity to be formed by the principals of R.W. Spears, LLC (the "Tenant"). The governing body of the Issuer will not pass an ordinance authorizing the issuance of such revenue bonds until the public hearing has been concluded.

Notice is further given, in accordance with K.S.A. 121744e, that the Issuer intends to issue the Bonds and lease the facility to the Tenant as set out above.

Grant to assist CCC in building duplex

BY ANDY TAYLOR chronicle@taylornews.org COFFEYVILLE — Coffeyville Community College officials on Monday announced the development of a housing construction project involving CCC classes.

Heather Pollet, who serves as vice president for career and technical education, announced at the CCC trustee meeting of a \$350,000 grant that was awarded to CCC through the Kansas Department of Commerce's FRAME (Fostering Residential Advancement through Mentoring and Education) program.

The grant will be used by CCC to build a duplex utilizing CCC's construction technology program and students.

Students involved in CCC's construction technology, electrical, plumbing and HVAC programs will be involved in the duplex's construction. More details about the

project will be announced at a later date.

Monday's meeting, college trustees: • approved a contract with the Chanute-based accounting firm Jarred, Gilmore and Phillips, PA, for the college's fiscal 2025 financial audit. The firm will be paid \$31,500

• approved the purchase of 318 student desks and chairs in the Arts and Sciences Buildings. The furniture will be purchased through a local vendor, Service Office, for \$87,000.

The new desks and chairs will replace the traditional all-in-one chair/desk model.

• approved a contract with Spartan Ram Jack to repair the foundation on the southeast corner of Nellis East Hall. The firm will be paid \$21,385 to repair the foundation.

The foundation has shown signs of settling, which was exacerbated with two years
