Cimarron man dies from motor vehicle accident

A Cimarron man, Jeff Bogner, 50, lost his life Friday evening as a result of a motor vehicle accident east of Garden City. At approximately 6:35 p.m., Bogner, driving a 2009 Kawasaki motorcycle, was eastbound on US Highway 50 when a westbound 2009 Ford F150 pickup, driven by Alondra Felix, 28, Garden City, attempted to turn south in front of the motorcycle into a trailer park at 4170 E. US Highway

50, according to a Kansas Highway Patrol report. The motorcycle struck the passenger side of the pickup, where the cab and bed meet. Bogner was transported to St. Catherine Hospital by ambulance, where he died of his injuries. Felix had no apparent injuries from the crash. Felix was not wearing a seat belt at the time of the accident and Bogner was not wearing a helmet.

Holcomb Police Department roles out new bike patrol unit

The Holcomb Police Department has announced its brand-new Bike Patrol Unit. This is a proactive step toward enhancing community engagement, improving public safety, and increasing officer visibility in neighborhoods, parks, and public events. The Bike Patrol Unit is designed to strengthen the department's presence in areas that are difficult to patrol by vehicle and foster stronger relationships between officers and community members. Officers on bike patrol will be able to respond quickly in crowded areas, navigate tight

spaces, and engage more personally with residents. "Our goal is to be approachable and accessible," Holcomb Police Chief Randy Ralston said. "The Bike Patrol will allow officers to interact more directly with the public, deter crime through increased visibility, and provide a safer, more connected Holcomb." The bike officers are fully equipped with specialized gear and have undergone training in bike handling, tactical riding, and community-oriented policing techniques. The unit will be deployed throughout the

year, especially during community events, school activities, and high-traffic times in residential areas. Trump administration ends protected status for Honduras, Nicaragua

WASHINGTON — U.S. Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem ended temporary protections Monday for nationals from Nicaragua and Honduras, opening up roughly 76,000 people to deportations by early September. The move is the latest effort by President Donald Trump's

administration to wind down legal statuses, such as Temporary Protected Status, amid an immigration crackdown and pledge to carry out mass deportations. So far, the Trump administration has moved to end legal statuses, including work authorizations and deportation protections, for more than half a million immigrants. TPS has been used

since the 1990s and is granted to nationals from countries deemed too dangerous to return to due to violence, natural disasters or other unstable conditions. Roughly 72,000 Hondurans and 4,000 Nicaraguans had temporary protections since 1999 following Hurricane Mitch, a Category 5 storm that destroyed parts of Central America and
