ORDINANCE ANAUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A LOAN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF OAKLEY, KANSAS AND THE STATE OF **ACTING** KANSAS, THROUGH BY AND **KANSAS** THE DEPARTMENT HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF **OBTAINING A LOAN** FROM THE KANSAS **PUBLIC** WATER SUPPLY LOAN FUND FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING A WATER **PUBLIC SUPPLY** PROJECT; **ESTABLISHING** Α **DEDICATED SOURCE** OF REVENUE FOR REPAYMENT OF SUCH LOAN; AUTHORIZING **APPROVING** AND C E R T A I N **DOCUMENTS** INCONNECTION THEREWITH; AND AUTHORIZING **OTHER CERTAIN** ACTIONS CONNECTION WITH \mathbf{THE} LOAN AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, the Safe Drinking Water Amendments of 1996 [PL I 04-182] to the Drinking Water Safe "Federal Act (the established the Act") Drinking Water Loan Fund to assist public water supply systems in financing the costs infrastructure needed to achieve or maintain compliance with the Federal Act and to protect the public health and authorized Environmental Protection Agency (the "EPA") to administer revolving loan program operated by the individual states; and

WHEREAS, to fund

the state fund program, the EPA will make annual capitalization grants to the states, on the condition that each state provide a state match for such state's revolving fund; and

WHEREAS, passage of the Kansas Public Water Supply Loan Act, K.S.A. 65-163d et seq., as amended (the "Loan Act"), the State of Kansas (the "State") has established the Kansas Public Water Supply Loan Fund (the "Revolving Fund") for purposes of the Federal Act; and

WHEREAS, under the Loan Act, the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment ("KDHE") is given the responsibility for administration management of the Revolving Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Development Kansas Finance Authority (the "Authority") and KDHE have entered into a Master Indenture (the "Master Indenture") pursuant to which KDHE agrees to enter into Loan Agreements with Municipalities for public water supply projects(the"Projects") and to pledge the Loan Repayments (as defined in the Master Indenture) received pursuant to such Loan Agreements to Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority is authorized under K.S.A. 74-8905(a) and the Loan Act to issue revenue bonds (the "Bonds") for the purpose of providing funds to implement the State's requirements under the Federal Act and to loan the same, together with available funds from the EPA capitalization grants, to Municipalities

WHEREAS, City of Oakley, Kansas "Municipality") (the is a municipality as said term is defined in the Loan Act which operates a water system (the "System"); and

WHEREAS, the System is a Public Water Supply System, as said term is defined in the Loan Act;

WHEREAS, Municipality has, pursuant to the Loan submitted Act, Application to KDHE to obtain a loan from the Revolving Fund to finance the costs of improvements to its System consisting of the following:

Construct transmission mains from each well to a new centralized treatment plant utilizing an ion exchange process and replace the existing user meters at each connection distribution system.

WHEREAS, Municipality has taken steps necessary all has complied with the provisions of the Loan Act and the provisions of K.A.R. 28-15-50 through 28-15-65 (the "Regulations") applicable thereto necessary to qualify for the loan; and

WHEREAS, **KDHE** info1med the Municipality that it has been approved for a loan in amount not to exceed \$6,860,886.00 (the "Loan") in order to finance the Project; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the hereby Municipality within the State for finds and determines
