The County Clerk inquired about the special alcohol money that is received from the State of Kansas on a quarterly basis. In the past, it was split to 1/3 to fund the DARE program and 2/3 sent to Southeast Kansas Mental Health to help fund programs for prevention and prevent abuse. The Sheriff's office no longer conducts the DARE program as it has been taken over by the school district. She asked if the county wanted to send the full amount to SEKMH or how the Commissioners wanted to allocate the funds. The Commissioners agreed to not distribute any more funds to SEKMH and will research other ways to utilize the funds that fall in line with KSA 79-41a04.

Insurance Renewal Rhonda Fernandez, Consultants, met with the commission. She reviewed the health insurance renewal with Blue Cross Blue Shield which reflected an 18% increase in premium. All other insurances offered remained relatively the same as the previous year. Discussion was held on self-funding and how it is beneficial to the county.
