Nora's creativity and amazing energy was demonstrated in her love of quilting, genealogy, creative writing, crocheting, sewing and spending time with her grandchildren and great grandchildren.

When Cabbage Patch dolls were in short supply, Nora made over 50 "look-alike" dolls to sell and give away, each had their own theme, and she called them "Nora's kids."

Once her last child moved away, she wrote and assembled books for each of her eight children highlighting their childhood that included stories, photos, newspaper clippings, and her personal diary entries. She also wrote a book about her time in the Nurses Corps entitled "My Life as a Student Nurse-US Cadet Nurse Corps at Mercy Hospital, Parsons, Kansas."
