The estimated total project cost would be \$766,484 with the city's match through other funds estimated to be \$184,484.

City Manager Brad Matkin said city staff will find the funding "one way or the other."

"This has been a long process," he said.

Mayor Tim VanHoecke asked if there were any comments, questions or input from the public.

Commissioner Tracy Dancer asked Moore if the state needs to inspect the building that is the focus of the grant.

Moore said the engineering inspections throughout the process will be done by Jason Dickman with Earles Engineering & Inspection.

"The only thing the state will do, I'll work with them monitoring the files throughout the grant," Moore said.

After the public hearing, Wells said he thought the commission had approved a motion to pursue the grant at a previous meeting.

"We have to authorize all the paperwork," City Clerk Lisa Lewis said.

"We still have to have a public hearing," VanHoecke said.

Other business

- Commissioners tabled discussion on proposals for a sales tax ballot question as presented by Matkin until the commission's May 20 meeting. There was discussion on conducting a town hall meeting prior to that date to present details on the proposals to citizens.

"This is something to get us going and get that question answered," he said. "When we're closer to bud-

get, we can know whether or not we can expand training for the clerk's office or go somewhere else."

Johnson said he can also talk to Walker and staff in her office to design an HR plan if commissioners choose.

Milburn-Kee said her concern is there is the "possibility for a conflict of interest there, for at least some complaints."

"There could be," Johnson said. "I'd be glad to help on any of that."
