Isolation, loneliness

Social isolation is not having relationships, contact with, or support from others. Johannes notes a 2024 study from Harvard university that indicates those who are socially isolated have a 32% increase in earlier death.

Loneliness is the feeling of being alone, disconnected, or not close to others. That group, according to the 2024 study, has a 14% increase in early death.

"If you are socially isolated and also lonely ... my goodness," Johannes said. "It is no wonder our lifespan in the United States seems to be shorter than it once was."

Perhaps a surprise finding, older Americans - over the age of 50 -- are less likely to feel socially isolated or lonely compared to younger Americans. Johannes says many in the older generation "were raised in a time where institutions were prevalent.'

'Some research does show that texting still provides a social connection," Johannes said.

Johannes touted the importance of the state's extension network, which provides numerous local programs for residents that include physical activity, leadership, health, nutrition and more.

"If the psychological effects of understanding that you're disconnected and then feeling some discomfort about that lasts for 6-8 weeks persistently, then the person may be feeling depressed," she said. "That's when the person needs to have a provider who could support them.' out and support them."

Johannes said online behavioral health providers can be an effective way to address issues of isolation or loneliness. She also encourages Kansans to contact their **Bucks Grove News** by Colleen Reamer

The second scripture read was Romans 5: 1-5. These passages tell of how Paul is saying that we have been justified through faith and we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ through whom local community mental we have gained access by faith into the grace in which we now stand. We

glory in our suffering because it produces perseverance, character and hope and hope does not put us to shame. God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

Lay Pastor Hefty then read to us from John 16: 12-15. This Gospel Reading tells of how Jesus is telling people that when the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own, he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. He will glorify Jesus because it is from Him that he will receive what he wants to make known to you. Jesus tells them that all that belongs to the Father is His and that is why He said the Spirit will receive from Him what he will make known to them.

Lay Pastor Hefty's message was about wisdom. He spoke about how we send our children off to college so they can get the knowledge they need to be successful in life. So must we be sent to school to know what it is that God has for us.

He said there are many things out there calling themselves wisdom but it is the Spirit of God to

reveal the truth. То be able to sort out the wisdom from everything else God has for us we must be seekers of God and connected to God to know exactly what it is that God would have for us as truth and would have for us as wisdom. He said the challenge is being connected to God and knowing what it is that God wants.

He then told us the story of Joseph and how his brothers were jealous of him and threw him in a well. You know that Joseph, while in the well, prayed to God to save him. Joseph then interpreted their dreams and told the cupbearer he'd be restored to pharaoh and the baker would lose his head. That is what happened and the cupbearer told him I will tell the pharaoh about you. He's glad because now he has an in. It just took two years for the cupbearer to remember him. The pharaoh had a dream and asked Joseph to interpret his dream and Joseph told him there was going to be seven years of plenty and then there would be seven years of drought. 
