

Area athletes brought home four championships and a slew of other medals last week from the Kansas State High School Activities Association All-Class Track Meet.

Wamego's boys accounted for two of those championships.

Slade Smith jumped for a new personal record of 6'9" and broke his own school record along with earning state gold.

The boys 4x800m relay team of Peyton Parker, Isaac Ibendahl, Tony Shea and Braxton Williams kept a four year winning streak alive with Williams' thrilling come-from-behind win for the gold in the anchor leg. In the process the team broke the meet – and school record.

"Slade was the best jumper in 4A all season," said WHS Coach Steve Fritz. "I was really excited for him to finish it off at the state meet with a new PR.

"The men's 4x800m ran


