Free Legal Answers Marks One-Year Anniversary

PRESS RELEASE TOPEKA — The Kansas Bar Association will celebrated the first anniversary of Kansas Free Legal Answers (https://kansas.freelegalanswers.org) on Law Day, May 1. This virtual legal advice clinic, hosted by the American Bar Association and funded by the Kansas Bar Foundation, allows income-eligible Kansans to submit legal questions for volunteer attorneys to answer. Kansas is among 42 states participating in this national program.

In its first ten months, 550 down barriers between in- tee. Bill was a member of the St. Patrick Catholic Church, Kingman.


Survivors include brothers Abe, Jr. and Roy; sister Julianne (Jim) Mahathy; nephew Mikabe Erdman; and niece
