The Lions Club is holding the show on the Memorial Ballfields from 1 to 3 p.m. Julie McClain said they got the idea from one of the Lions Club members, who remembered putting on a dog show with her sisters. “It was fun, and she suggested it,” McClain said. “We wanted to give people a nice spring activity.” There will be several categories to compete in, including best costume for dogs, best costume for humans and dogs, best trick, ugliest dog, waggiest tail, longest ears, best kid
