TRACK

Haven travels to Conrad Nightingale

The 54th annual Conrad Nightingale track meet brought some of the best area teams to Halstead on April 25. Cheney won the girls’ side of things with 95 points, with Hesston in second place with 83 points. Halstead came in seventh with 47 points, and Haven scored a point for the girls. On the boys’ side, Moundridge captured the crown with 83 points. Hesston finished third with 72 points, and the host Dragons were tied for fourth with 66 points. Sedgwick’s boys scored 29 points for 10th place, and Haven ended with 19 points and 11th place.

In the boys 100m, Aiden Hoopes of Haven edged out Hesston’s Daxon Deering for third place. Haven’s Van Loop finished sixth.

Halstead’s Breeson Bigley brought home third in the 200m event, with Deering in fourth place.

Bigley and Keaston Shields finished first and second in the 400m for the Dragons, with Lyndon Dillon from Hesston coming in eighth.

Swather distance runner Casey Heinrichs finished second in the 800m run, with Haven’s Austin Honeycutt just missing out on scoring points. Henry Harrington finished seventh in the 1600m for Halstead. Haven’s Isaiah Doherty crossed the line in fourth place in the 3200m run.

Moving to the hurdles, Hesston’s Eli Haug finished eighth in the 110m event. In the 300m portion of the event, Swather hurdler Jamison Kohl finished third, and Sedgwick’s Noah Little came in fifth.

Halstead edged Hesston in the 4x100 relay, but the Dragons were topped by Pratt in the 4x400m relay.

Evan Wiedeman of Halstead finished fifth in the high jump. Sedgwick’s Little won the long jump, as teammate Dallas Lagree finished fifth. Halstead was well represented by Joey Millspaugh in fourth. Haven’s Blake Richey netted seventh place for the Wildcats. Little also snagged the crown for triple jump, and

Millspaugh finished fifth.

Hesston’s Lydon Dillon took home first place in the pole vault, with teammate Max Phillips going over in third place. Karter Gonzalez took home the first place in discus for the Swathers, while Halstead’s Connor Herman snagged seventh, and Haven’s Cody Holzrichter took home eighth. Hesston’s Emmet O’Halloran threw the javelin far enough to capture fifth place.

Swather shot putter Josh Duerksen bagged second place, while Halstead saw Herman take third and Kurt Faudel finish fifth. Ayden Johnston of Sedgwick finished eighth.

On the girls’ side, Hesston saw track icon Ashley Lehman win the 100m, 200m and 400m events. Teammates Ella Phillips joined Lehman with seventh place in the 100m and Maddy Colborn in sixth in the 200m. Hesston’s Reese Quinn finished third in the 800m. Quinn also finished second in the 3200m run.

Halstead’s Annie Williams finished second in the 100m hurdles, as Dragon teammate Mackenzie Ervin captured fifth. Williams also finished second in the 300m hurdles.

In the field events, Hesston’s Ella Phillips won the high jump by one inch over Halstead’s Jordy Schroeder and Williams, as the Dragon duo tied for second. Hesston’s Colborn took second in the triple jump, and teammate Lehman also won pole vault.

Kahlyn Davis of Halstead came in fourth in the discus. Davis and Dalaina Schutte finished third and fifth, respectively, in the javelin. Hesston’s Kaycee Mason finished second in the shot put, as Haven’s Rilynn Patry snagged seventh

Andale competes at Clearwater

The Andale track team traveled to a 13-team field meet at Clearwater on April 25.

Wyatt Lockhart finished seventh in the 100m dash.

Wyatt Helten won the high jump, as Kelp came in sixth. Schrandt took home the long jump, with Lane Parthermer and Jak Krehbiel finishing sixth and seventh, respectively. Ethan Eck slipped by Parthermer in the triple jump finals. Noah Horsch, Colt Lane and Hudson Tankersley finished first, second and third, continuing to dominate pole vault.

Cooper Marx, Hunter Grimes and Jrayton Dansel same in second, third and fourth, respectively, in the discus, with Marx and Grimes finishing first and second in the hammer throw. Arwyn Hennessey won both the 1600m and 3200m, with Miriam Mazzarelli finishing fifth and seventh in the races. Abbi Winter snagged fifth in the 100m hurdles, with Rylee Meyer (second), Winter (fourth) and Emma Meyer (sixth) in the 300m hurdles.

The 4x400m and 4x800m relay teams both finished second.

Abbey McNeal went over the bar in fifth place for high jump. Taya Orth finished seventh in long jump. Addy Orth finished fifth in triple jump, with Rylee Winter in seventh place. In the pole vault, Hally Horsch snagged second, Hannah Spexarth flew to fourth and Abigail Patton slid over in sixth place.

Emily Struckman tied for second in the discus, as Paige Brand finished sixth in front of seventh-place Brooke Grimes. Struckman won the hammer throw, with Brand in third and Emma-ree Baalmann fourth. Taya and Addy Orth went first and second in the javelin, with Struckman winning shot put and Brand finishing fourth.
