Cowley tacked on three more runs in the sixth.

Jake Hobbs, Hudson Roberts, Carter Rose, Stetson Etheridge and Lucas Weaver combined for five innings of relief, allowing only two hits and one run.

Kolby Heskett (0-1), the first of seven pitchers used by the Blue Dragons (29-6), took the loss despite allowing only two hits and one unearned run in three innings.

Cowley scored at least one run against six of Hutchinson's seven pitchers and out-hit the Blue Dragons 13-6.

Sophomore third baseman Logan Smith went 4 for 5 with two doubles and a run batted in. First baseman Quinn Groehl added three hits and scored a pair of runs.

The Tigers play a doubleheader against Labette at 1 p.m. today at Pittsburg State University before returning to Ark City to host the Cardinals in a 1 p.m. Saturday twinbill.

Opening lead – king of diamonds.  
Optimism is unquestionably a healthy asset at the bridge table, but pessimism is also a desirable concomitant of card play. Basically, you have to be a worrier to be a good cardplayer.  
Consider this deal played by Edwin Kantar in the Vanderbilt Teams some years ago. He opened three hearts, and his partner, Ron Von der Porten, leaped to five notrump (the Grand Slam Force), asking South to bid seven hearts if he held two of the three top trump honors. Kantar duly obliged, and West led the king of diamonds. It was immediately obvious that the grand slam was cold if the opponents' spades were divided normally – that is, either 3-3 or 4-2 – so Kantar's only concern was to try to overcome a 5-1 or 6-0 division, if it existed. This he proceeded to do when he won the diamond and played five rounds of trump, producing this position:

♣ A 9

**West** Immaterial

♣ K J

**South**  
♠ 8  
♥ 6 4  
♦ 8 5  
♣ Q 8

Kantar now led another trump, discarding a club from dummy, and East, who could not spare a spade, was forced to discard a club. Kantar thereupon cashed the A-K-Q of spades, discarding two diamonds, and – hoping that East had been compelled to unguard clubs – cashed the ace of clubs. When the monarch obligingly fell on the ace, the grand slam was home.
