**Kansas VINE expands resources for crime victims**

The Kansas Office of the Attorney General has announced new features to Kansas VINE aimed at helping victims of crime more easily locate services and support. Kansas VINE is the state's automated victim notification system that alerts users to custody status changes for adult offenders held in county jails. The service is often used by crime victims who want immediate notification when an offender is released or transferred. Two new tools — a searchable "Service Provider Directory" and an "I Need Guidance" feature — are now available. The directory allows users to search for state-approved local and national service providers by organization

name, services offered or type of crime. Listed providers may assist with crisis services, counseling, housing, financial resources and victim advocacy. Arica Roland, associate division chief of the Attorney General's Victim Services Division, said locating help after a crime can be overwhelming. She noted the directory is still being built and search results may be limited at first as additional providers are added. Service providers are encouraged to submit their information to be included in the directory. Kansas VINE is free and confidential, available 24/7 online, by phone at 1-866-574-8463, or through the VINELink mobile app.

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offer protection: the assessment cap would protect individual properties, while the revenue limit would help slow government growth. Unfortunately, the assessment cap was rejected by the House - even after the House offered a 10% cap and no rollback on assessment values; the Senate position was 3% or lower with a 2022 baseline year. To move on the measure, I was asked to acquiesce to a 9% cap, with the understanding it could be lowered by statute, and a baseline assessment value year of 2024, which the House accepted - but rejected it on the House floor. There is still a slim chance to pass something in veto session. Some House members continue to spread misinformation about assessment limits, demonstrating a lack of understanding of the legislation. For example, claims that it "will hurt first-time homebuyers"

are inaccurate: the measure transfers the capped assessed value to the new homeowner. A major benefit because the capped assessment value goes with the property, unlike today where some are seeing increases that can tax them out of their home in just a few years. As Chairman of the Senate Tax Committee, I worked day and night trying to get a limit on property tax increases passed - one that would protect homeowners and save them money. We need to stop these runaway increases. However, as a leader in lowering your taxes, there are members of the legislature trying to blame me for not getting results when they vote against the limits. Go figure. The Legislature will return April 9 for consideration of bills vetoed by the Governor and possible action on other legislation. Currently, there are 50 bills on the Governor's desk for consideration and over 80 bills on the way to her desk. All legislation can be found at www.KSlegislature.gov.

**REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP)**

The Board of County Commissioners of Coffey County will accept sealed proposals to provide design engineering services to replace two bridges on rural local roads near LeRoy, KS. The two bridges are combined into one package of two design engineering contracts.

Bridge No. 169 (NBI160997005667) is a 3-span, 130.5 long concrete slab bridge with a 20' roadway width that carries Oxen Road over Turkey Creek approximately four miles west and 1.2 miles south of the town on LeRoy. Coffey County envisions a replacement bridge able to carry legal loads with a 28' roadway width.

Bridge No. 156 (NBI161007905660) is a 2-span, 37' long steel multi-beam bridge with a 15.4' roadway width. It is located on 3rd Road just west of its intersection with Underwood Road, or approximately one mile south and 1.9 miles east of LeRoy. Coffey County envisions a replacement bridge able to carry legal loads with a 28' roadway width.

Coffey County has applied for Kansas Local Bridge Improvement Program 2027 funding for Bridge No. 169 and for Off-System

Bridge Program, FFY 2028 funding for Bridge No. 156. Regardless of construction funding awards for each bridge, Coffey County will go forward with design of the two replacement bridges. Proposals shall be received at the Highway Department at 1510 S. 6th St., Burlington, Kansas, 66839 until 2:00 p.m., April 15, 2026. Envelopes should be plainly marked on the outside "Bridges 169 & 156 Design Engineering." The proposal should include a proposed fee schedule for required services. It is anticipated that a cost-plus-net-fee contract with a not-to-exceed contract amount will be utilized, although an alternative contract type may be considered. Coffey County reserves the right to select a consultant it deems most qualified regardless of proposed fee schedule. The proposal should comment on the appropriateness of the attached Scope of Services.
